SHV India is proud to receive the 'Lapwing Award 2019' on 9th April 2019 at Lauswolt, The Netherlands for 'Beti Bachao Beti Padoo' work of SGF. SGF adopts girl children who live in dire poverty and also who are physically & mentally challenged / disabled, ailing with terminal illness, rescued child labour, rescued street children and help them with education and related facilities. This is simply incredible for SHV India to be chosen as the winner amongst 28 entries at SHV Holdings level worldwide! Until now SHV India received 5 Lapwing Awards, out of which 4 are received for Corporate Social Responsibility.

On 18th April 2019, Mrs. Marieke Schoningh & Mr. Steven Sels presented the Lapwing Award to SGF Trustee & Secretary Mr. K. Sreeman. Speaking on the occasion Mrs. Marieke said that the

education initiatives to children with disabilities, taken up by SUPERGAS Foundation have been found with merit and conferred SUPERGAS India the Lapwing Award 2019.

For those of you who may be interested to know the context of Lapwing with the Award given by SHV, it goes like this – Lapwing birds are found in UK, Netherlands and parts of Europe. The bird is known for its slow, irregular wingbeat in flight, acrobatic upward flight and downwards diving and shrill voice. It displays great strength, agility and enthusiasm in its movements. Lapwings are also known to their adaptability to change. Earlier the Lapwing were laying eggs on the surface of the ground but faced the risk of foxes eating away their eggs. Lapwings have overcome this challenge by learning to lay eggs on nests built on the trees to protect their progeny as their species is facing the danger of extinction. Owing to the above special qualities of the bird, SHV has rightly chosen to name its award as Lapwing Award.

The children and staff of Govt. Higher Secondary School Parapathi Village, Madurai were facing hardship due to lack of adequate water facility. Due to the water scarcity, the school was purchasing water from outside. In view of the same, the school management and the local Gram Panchayat of Parapathi village at Madurai have requested SGF to provide water facility by contributing for drilling a bore-well. SGF has

swung into action and got a bore-well of 605 feet drilled in the school premises. The bore-well facility was switched on by Mr. Santanu Guha on 4th March 2019 in the presence of school children, teaching & non-teaching staff. Children expressed their joy on receiving uninterrupted supply of water for drinking and utility purposes.

Health can never take a backseat. A very few take health checkups seriously for various reasons ranging from affordability to awareness. SGF continued its crusade in providing preventive health-care to the Autorickshaw drivers and the local community. As of April 2019, we have organized 15 free medical camps thereby benefitting 2633 persons who got their health checkup done. To improve awareness, doctor counseling was given on the dangers of alcohol, cigarette smoking and tobacco consumption. The smiles of gratitude for the relentless efforts of the SUPERGAS colleagues who volunteered in these camps have indeed fueled our passion to continue making a difference to our society!

North Region's benevolence

Education is an important right for every child and so is comfortable study. Unfortunately, some of the schools in India lack basic resources such as benches and white boards. The Government Junior High School in Rahul Vihar, Ghaziabad is one such school. SGF always strived to better the education facilities for the children and this school was no exception. On 16th March 2019, our SGF volunteers in the North Region stepped in and made sure that adequate number of benches and white boards were available to the children. On 14th February 2019, a terrorist suicide bomb attack was carried out on a convoy of Indian Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) at Pulwama (Jammu & Kashmir) in which 44 Para military personnel travelling in a bus got killed. The attack has attracted global condemnation by most countries across the world. Our Nation is mourning the death of these martyrs who gave their lives for the country. Their families are inconsolable and there is not a dry eye in the country at the moment. Sitting in our rooms, seeing TV news or reading the newspaper and feeling sad & helpless won't help. But what will help is, doing what we can.

'Bharat Ke Veer' was initiated in April 2017 by Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India with a purpose for the citizens to help the families of the martyred soldiers. The donated money would reach the 'Bharat Ke Veer' Corpus Fund. With a benevolent objective of rendering financial assistance to the dependent families of the martyred soldiers, SGF has decided to donate a humble sum to the 'Bharat Ke Veer' Corpus Fund. Accordingly, our SGF cheque was handed over by SGF Trustee & Secretary Mr. K. Sreeman to Shri GHP Raju, IPS – Inspector General of CRPF, Southern Head Quarters at Hyderabad on 26th March 2019. Mr. Sreeman gave a floral tribute to the martyred soldiers in the presence of the IG and other CRPF personnel and paid our condolences. Mr. Raju and other CRPF officers have deeply appreciated the noble support given by SGF to our 'Bharat Ke Veer'.

The children were thrilled to welcome Mrs. Upasana and to take her through their hard-work, aptly coined as 'voiced colors'. She spoke about her long association with Ashray Akrti and said that the children are showing their talent & expression through their pictures. She said that education is not only about books and classrooms, it's about learning from every day experiences and expressing yourself through different art forms. SGF has been supporting Ashray Akrti's children and skill trainees since the last 3 years. On behalf of SGF, Mr. Sreeman & his family participated in the event and had a pleasant interaction with the children, staff & management of Ashray Akrti and with Mrs. Upasana. Mr. Sreeman said that the paintings were spell-binding and that the children of Ashray Akrti broke boundaries of regular education.



Helping students dealwith failures & setbacks

In order to sensitize the students to deal courageously with academic setbacks and failures, a session was conducted by SGF Trustee & Secretary Mr. Sreeman Kadali on 1st May 2019 to the 10th grade students of St. Josephs High School, Hyderabad, who were expecting their exam results in the first week of May 2019. The students were made to understand that set-backs in academics are a small part of many challenges in life and that children should not

High School and College going students these days are under tremendous pressure to perform and score top marks in their academics. The stress levels for them are so high that it is affecting their well-being and over-all physical and mental health. Some of them are slipping into depression and feeling a sense of low self-esteem, lack of purposefulness, despair and as a result few of them are committing

become disheartened with any adverse results that they harm themselves. That, failures are stepping stones to success and one should always be resilient in rising above the challenges and suicide is not the right thing. Students were explained that suicides not only nip-off the bright future of the student, but would also impact their family, friends, teachers and well-wishers. The children had a very interactive session and they shared their thoughts on peer-pressure, high score expectations of parents and the teachers. The children agreed that suicide is not a solution and they vowed to pass on the word that 'life is beautiful, say no to suicide'. Ms. Pavani of SGF has assisted in the session. Mr. Sreeman is poised to continue his campaign in coming days with many other under-privileged students studying in various schools on this sensitive topic.
