They in-turn acknowledged SGF's support for providing infrastructure facilities to their children. We were the proud recipients of the Best CSR Partner Award from Ashray Akruti. The highlights of the program were dance, songs and skit showcased by the children of Ashray Akruti.



SGF's benevolence in Tuticorin

The recent Tuticorin riots ended up in upsetting the civic balance in the town of Tuticorin in Tamil Nadu. Lives were lost, people were injured and livelihoods were affected. Mr. Maria Siluvai was one amongst those who lost their livelihood. The District Collector of Tuticorin, hearing about SGF activities during the Kerala floods, had requested us to help out the individual with employable livelihood. On 16th July 2018, the Deputy Collector and Mr. Kadambur Raju, Information and Publicity Minister handed over the keys of a new auto rickshaw (3-wheeler taxi) to Mr. Maria Siluvai, donated by SGF. Our colleagues Mr. Babu and Mr. Prabhakaran participated in the hand over.





Our colleagues visited AGAPE (Ambassadors of Goodwill for AIDS Patients Everywhere) school on 1st December 2018 and interacted with the students on health, education and career. Later, the children flew balloons as a token of reverence to the souls who passed away due to AIDS.



Female personal hygiene is a big issue in the Indian Subcontinent and this arises mainly due to lack of awareness. We also took the opportunity to bridge that gap and visited CHORD and AGAPE Schools on 1st December 2018. Our team contributed personal care provisions to the adolescent girl children and had an interaction with them on personal hygiene.





Volunteering for social cause

Education is every child's right. It is the launch pad with which every child hopes to reach towering heights in life. Our SGF volunteers in Bavla, Babra and Vadakkal decided to help these primary education institutions by providing basic requirements like geometry boxes, cooking utensils, gas stove, cupboards etc. Our team experienced a sense of happiness as they had helped the future stars to get a step closer to their dreams.



Devnaar - The Chosen Ones

The visually impaired children of Devnar always hold a special place in the hearts of our SGF volunteers. We handed over to them grocery provisions for one month and also visited their new building premises which is under construction. Our team also spent some quality time with the children and management. Visual impairment can never dim the light in a child's heart.



Two additional floors for CHORD - SUPERGAS skill centre

We are aware that SGF has contributed for construction of ground & first floor of CHORD SUPERGAS Centre for Learning [Education & Skill Development] at Bollaram Hyderabad in 2016. The building is run by NGO CHORD as an employable skill center & kindergarten school. As the same has become successful, CHORD has requested SGF for expansion of the facility by laying second & third floor. SGF has contributed for the same and currently the second floor construction has been completed. Construction of third floor is under-way. Once the construction is completed, the building would be able to provide various additional skill trainings which inturn would provide livelihood for vulnerable youth and also provide ample space for the kindergarten school chilrdren.

Foundation Stone laying for CC Roads - Choutuppal

We believe that access to good roads is a civic requirement. We found that villagers of the Survail village, Choutuppal area did not have proper roads. On the request of the local community, we sprung into action and under rural development CSR scheme 'Swarnim', we decided to lay CC road of 500 meters. The foundation stone was laid on 1st September 2018, in the presence of MLA, Mr. Prabhakar Reddy who expressed his sincere gratitude to SGF. We felt elated as one more mission was accomplished. Roads have been laid and villagers are happy with the kind gesture of SGF.
